

September 9 of this year marked the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of California's statehood, and yet there was little fanfare. One hundred years ago, for California's Diamond Jubilee, an eight-day celebration took place in San Francisco. The Diamond Jubilee parade on the final day lasted nearly six hours and consisted of 55,000 marchers over a 15-mile stretch. An estimated 650,000 people were in attendance, and there was a display of fireworks over the Civic Center!

There was also a huge celebration for the sixtieth anniversary of statehood in 1910, to showcase the rebuilding of San Francisco and surrounding cities that suffered damage from the 1906 earthquake and fire.

Kathryn Ayres, vice president of the San Francisco Bay Area Post Card Club, will show postcards and other ephemera from past Admission Day celebrations, back when Californians knew how to party!

Yerba Buena. Over 200 members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, led by Samuel Brannan, made the arduous journey around Cape Horn.
